Buttercup have been exploring the local community. We have created a "People Who Help Us" board in our room with lots of special people within the community who help us. This board was made to help the children with their cognitive development as we are beginning to make connections between each person that helps us and what they do in the community. We have even visited the places where we can find these people. We have been exploring the children's thoughts on these adventures and giving them the tools to express themselves through art activities with a variety of media. Whilst creating these pictures, we have had some lovely discussions about the wider world around us. The beautiful pictures the children have created really help us create an image of how the children are feeling through their exploration of the different media on offer!

Recently we have been expressing ourselves through arts and crafts and focusing a lot on exploring through painting, messy play and mark making with different objects. We have also had a lot of sensory tuff trays where the children got to feel different textures and materials through play. We have also been going on local bus journeys into the community, visiting the ducks and various parks. While out, we have been looking at transport, from cars and buses to airplanes. We have been exploring new books and focusing on one book a month and incorporating this into the tuff tray with all the animals or colours that are in that book. The children can then relate this to the book.

Next month, we will be continuing to go on our bus journeys since the children have taken a great interest in this. We will also be focusing on our colours, numbers and shapes. We will be doing this through different activities e.g., matching colours with items of that same colour, counting different materials and learning to draw out shapes. The children have already shown great interest in this.

Our garden had a huge makeover and we have enjoyed watching it all come together and become fit for use again. We also loved watching our sunflowers grow – they're huge!
