Buttercup have been exploring different cultures and celebrations. Recently we have been learning about Holi which is an Indian festival. We have had lots of fun doing this as through this we have looked at a variety of coloured messy play items. This has helped us to develop our cognitive development, using our senses and having the freedom to express ourselves and learn about others. The next celebrations we will be exploring will be Easter and Ramadan, through this we will be exploring star and moon sensory trays and Easter sensory trays, flash cards and spring animals. We have also had a nursery rhyme week where we have explored a variety of tuff trays linking to this. For example, 10 green bottles sensory, 5 little Ducks sensory and so on. This has really helped the children create an awareness of the links between props and the nursery rhymes we are singing and the development of their literacy and numeracy skills ①!

They've been really focused on colours recently, naming them and matching/sorting them, we had a very successful colour week last week, with lots of effort put into the children's outfits for the day and also learning about animals, naming them and their noises.

Weather Appropriate Clothing

All clothing provided for weather appropriate play **MUST** be clearly labelled. Please ensure your child has the following items to allow them to access all play experiences, scarfs, gloves, hats, wellies, waterproof suits, and sun hats.

As the nicer weather is approaching can we please ask that all children arrive at nursery with sun cream already applied. We will throughout the day reapply the sun cream where necessary.

If your child requires a specific sun cream, please provide this to the nursery clearly labelled.

These items must remain in the nursery where possible.

COVID 19

To help us deliver a successful programme for our nursery community we would ask that all parents and carers continue to follow the COVID 19 regulations and follow those requirements to the letter.

In particular, if anyone within your domestic bubble/household/support network is being tested for COVID 19, the whole household/bubble/network MUST self-isolate until the either 10 days have elapsed if the PCR test is positive, or the PCR test returns a negative result. No child should attend Almond Park Nursery whilst a test is underway, and the results are unknown.

Following this process will help ensure the whole Almond Park extended family is kept as safe as possible whilst COVID 19 remains within our wider community.
